From the Manse...

That first Pentecost saw the outpouring of God's spirit upon the disciples.

In an instant they were changed people, no longer fearful, no longer timid, and no longer locked away behind closed doors. For the sake of our communities and all people and in the power of the Spirit, may we bring love, light, healing, hope and peace to all.

Grove Extravaganza 24 June 2017

Anyone wishing to help with the St John's Church tent at **Grove and Wantage Extravaganza 2017** is very welcome to do so. **We are very open to having any Christians from any local churches.** You will need to be free at some point on Saturday 24 June; and to get to Grove Recreation Ground. No other meetings etc will be organised.

We've invited Street Pastors and Open the Book to see if they wish to be involved. We'd also love to hear from the alcohol awareness people if they wished to do something, even if only for an hour or so.

We plan to:

Offer prayer ministry for people who want it. I've asked the prayer ministry team for help, some are free. We do need more.

Offer other activities around the theme of listening to people, listening to our local community, of which Grove Parish Church, and other churches, are a big part. We will provide flyers, leaflets and copies of a gospel for people who wish to take them home.

There will be at least one children's activity which could be craft/dressing up/games and activities and/or play dough. Ideally, different activities will be offered at different points in the afternoon, so volunteers can do what they choose to do.

We will collect some of the children's thoughts about what is good about Grove and Wantage and our community – ideas around 'Food for Thought' decorated/written on paper plates, maybe some 'art of conversations' too, which we will display in the marquee. This will be available for adults too.

Adults can record their thoughts about life in Grove and Wantage, sharing stories etc. This may be audio/video recordings, writing etc. The idea is to capture thoughts on the day, listening to people and people filling in artwork/'food for thought'. We may then use what people say to feedback to church and promote future Extravaganzas!

For children and adults there will be a tree and some prayer labels so people can leave prayer requests on these prayer 'leaves' on the tree.

We may include a musical interlude. Some musicians (maybe from worship team) could come and sing songs; or teach one to us - dependent on who volunteers for what!

The political parties of this nation have now officially launched their campaigns for the 2017 General Election. Their policies are being proclaimed and their visions for how they see the future of our country, unveiled.

In sound bites, interviews, newspaper articles, leaflets, Party Political broadcasts, Facebook postings, television programmes and tweets, there is no escaping from the unrelenting (and sometimes confusing) propaganda that surrounds us.

Each party is setting out their stall and sharing their hopes, dreams and visions for the next five years.

They vie for our attention even as they do for our vote.

Each party tries to sway us as to why it is important we exercise our democratic right and put an "X" on the ballot paper on June 8th against the name of their party's candidate.

All of this is, of course, summed up in their party manifesto - that collection of policies and goals that they hope will enthuse people to vote for them and which will hold them accountable to the general public whilst in office if they happen to succeed next month.

The manifesto is saying in effect, this is who we are, this is what we are about, these are our values and this is what we will do.

In Luke's Gospel chapter 4, we find Jesus doing something very similar at the beginning of his public ministry. Verses 16-20 — often referred to as the "Nazareth Manifesto" — show him setting out his stall, saying what he is about, what he sees as being important and the role that he is going to fulfil.

Unlike with many politicians, there was no discrepancy between what he said and what he did – his actions fulfilled his words and his deeds his promises.

Who we vote for is the big question and ultimately it is up to each and every one of us to make that decision as we see best.

Within our Churches and faith groups, just as in Parliament, there will be Christians aligning themselves with the various political parties.

I guess that whatever party we eventually support, it is the one who, for us, most closely aligns itself with the words Jesus proclaimed in the synagogue in Nazareth; "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour."

Update on Community Chaplains at Great Western ParkKatherine Pickering

Earlier this year, our Circuit held a workshop led by Rev Robert Jones, to help us understand more about the role of a chaplain. Chaplaincy is already well established in certain fields of work and you may know of chaplains serving in the Forces, in education and young people's work, in hospitals, hospices and care homes, in agriculture, in prisons or in civic life. In more recent years there has been a growth in chaplaincy in shopping centres and businesses and in other work places. So what is a chaplain?

A chaplain offers a visible Christian presence, interacting with people in the community or in the workplace and is someone who goes out to where people are, to listen, to be alongside, to be a guest not a host. Whereas in our churches we are often seen to be a gathering community, inviting people to "join us", chaplaincy is not about "gathering in" but more about "going out". This pattern of "going out" reflects the ministry of Jesus who went out to minister wherever people were and he sent out his disciples to go and do the same.

A chaplain is available to those with faith and those who don't profess faith. Their role is not to preach but to listen and respond and if invited to do so, discuss their Christian faith.

Although workplace chaplaincy is well established, the idea of providing chaplains where people live rather than where they work seems to be new. As many of you know, our Circuit has been developing just such a vision – to offer chaplaincy in new housing areas, working collaboratively with other churches. Our focus has been on Great Western Park as this is the first and most advanced of the major developments planned in our Circuit. A small team has been working hard on the Circuit chaplaincy proposal, seeking to build relationships and complement other Christian initiatives at GWP, such as the flourishing community café and Rev Mark Bodeker's work establishing a new Anglican church, based at the UTC college.

Last month we advertised for two part-time community chaplains and we are delighted that Sarah Ifill and Libby Hawkness-Smith have been appointed to work at Great Western Park in Didcot.

Sarah is well known by many in the Circuit as she is a member and Worship Leader at Wallingford Methodist and currently the Senior Steward. Libby is an Anglican and in June will complete her training as a Lay Pioneer through the Church Mission Society. She is also a part-time School Pastor in the Reading area. She is looking forward to getting to know people in our Circuit. Sarah and Libby started work on 11th May and will use a chaplaincy "van" (a small motorhome) as their mobile base and visible presence.

We are very pleased that Tom Atkinson, a Didcot member, has designed the Community Chaplain logo which will be used on the van and elsewhere. Look out for the van and the new logo in the coming months!

Please pray for Sarah and Libby and those who will work with them as they take on their new roles. May they be assured of the prayers and encouragement of everyone in our churches as they seek to serve God in this new and exciting way. I look forward to working with them. Every blessing, *Katherine*

- Katherine as she takes on the extra role of line-managing the chaplains

- The flourishing community café on GWP, and its team of enthusiastic volunteers

May all involved in this pioneering project both seek and know God's guidance, to the glory of God and the furtherance of his kingdom.

Bookings now open for 3Generate youth event

Promising to be the biggest 3Generate yet, bookings have now opened for this year's children and youth assembly of the Methodist Church, taking place at a new, bigger, venue, with up to 1,000 young people and leaders expected to attend.

Following massive growth and growing demand for places in recent years, this year's event will run from $24^{th} - 26^{th}$ November at Pontins, Southport, for children and young people aged 8 - 23.

The weekend is shaped and designed by local groups made up of leaders, children and young people. There are age-appropriate sessions and activities with some sessions that will be intergenerational. 'The Well' stream for leaders will again offer dedicated sessions. In 2016, extra measures were introduced for young people with additional needs who wanted to attend and fully participate, something which the organisers intend to continue and build on this year.

Leaders will be responsible for their groups throughout the event and will be in group accommodation.

All age groups get the chance to take part in a huge variety of activities, different styles of worship, themed and issue-based workshops, exploring topics raised by the children and young people.

The 19-23 age group is designed for young people who have left school. This group follow their own programme which will be integrated with the overall programme for the event and therefore there will enjoy times together as a group as well as times with others. The group will be accommodated in its own dedicated set of chalets. Those over the age of 18 who have already left school are welcome to join this group.

During the weekend the young people also elect their own Youth President to serve for a year and represent them to the wider Methodist Church from 2018-2019.

Those who wish to attend but whose church is not organising its own group may be able to join another group from their Circuit or District. Event organisers may be able to assist with this. Full details are available on the website:






