



Wantage & Grove Street Pastors REPORT OF OUR DECEMBER 2017 ACTIVITIES

During December there were:

2 Friday night patrols, 3 Saturday night patrols and a New Year's Eve patrol

6 Patrols totalling 26 hours of cover involving 17 Street Pastors

18 pairs of flip-flops given, 29 bottles of water and 2 space blankets

380 lollies and Love Hearts

Surprisingly, December can be a fairly quiet time for our Street Pastors with many people presumably spending money on Christmas rather than on a night out. At the beginning of December we noticed a lot more men out in Wantage than women. Many had had lots to drink, so the party spirit wasn't completely gone!

We're pleased to say that we didn't have to deal with any serious incidents in Wantage or Grove, although we were on hand to help calm a few heated discussions and of course we found plenty of ladies in need of footwear in the early hours.

One of our teams spent time with a distressed lady that we had first met several years ago. We spent time listening and encouraging her, and ensured that she was able to get home safely.

New Year's Eve was a very busy night with over 600 hundred people out in Wantage celebrating the new year. The evening was very good-natured and passed without major incident. We joined in with lots of people around King Alfred's statue at midnight and cleared up where a few glasses had got broken. At the end of the night, two men engaged in a heated discussion but were swiftly separated by each of their friends and the situation didn't escalate any further.

Thanks to everyone who supported our stall at the Dickensian Evening at the beginning of December and especially to all those that worked so hard to make the event so successful!



Notes on Wantage "Awayday@Home"

Our "awayday" occurred on our own premises last Saturday 20th January. About fifty of us gathered and had a good day sharing together our hopes and dreams about the future of Wantage Methodists.

We started with a short act of worship in the Chapel.

In Isaiah 43 we read: "Stop dwelling on past events and brooding over days gone by. I am about to do something new...." This was very much the bidding of the day. We sang hymns 409 (Let us build a house whereAll are welcome) 660 (Called by Christ to be disciples every day in every place) and 658 (A charge to keep I have; a God to glorify) and shared time in prayer.

Then we reflected in small groups on what we valued about Wantage as a church community. What were the strengths of the church? Entitled "What's in the pot?" it was a chance to reflect on the positive things about our church. Individually we put on a card what we saw as the good things and we put these "in the pot".

After refreshment we resumed in the hall. Now we considered what we would write on a postcard to friends or family who had moved away in about 3 years' time about positive changes to us in Wantage. What were our dreams of what good things could happen in the next few years? This was a chance to reflect on what we should be doing in the near future. Each of us wrote our own postcard and these were gathered together.

Thanks are due to the team that prepared a simple but wholesome lunch for us all of soup, bread, cheese and fruit. There was even a box of chocolates!!

Lunch complete and the adults reassembled in the Chapel for a final session. Now we were reminded of some questions to ponder:

What are our priorities? What should we maintain?

What do we do better than others? What could we be a centre of excellence for? What new things should be doing? What should we stop doing? What does it mean to be the Church in the world today?

Next we were reminded of five characteristics of fruitful congregations:

Welcoming / hospitality / caring

Responsive and actively inclusive

Intentional spiritual development

Participatory and collaborative leadership

Enabling change – removing barriers

Then we reflected on these together again in small groups and comments were gathered on a flipchart.

Meanwhile the children had their own activity with Rosemary Perrow and two other friends from Abingdon where they built a house with different rooms with notes on the walls reflecting good and not so good things about church as they saw it. This was presented at the end of the afternoon and remained in the chapel for Sunday.

Keith and the stewards will be reviewing the input of the day and will be sharing this in due course. Thank you to all who contributed in any way to a useful and, we hope, stimulating day.

Property Matters

Lighting in the Chapel

Following the incident on Christmas Eve, we have had the contractors back to address the issues of the pelmet lighting. After a visit in January, the Architect has issued a report on the probable cause of the problem and negotiations are underway within those involved to reinstall the units in a way which will remove the problem and provide secondary restraint on the units.

For the time being chairs should not be set on the red lines in the carpet or closer to the walls.

Acoustics in the Chapel

It is proposed to install acoustic panels to the ceiling as this is expected to contribute the most immediate improvement. It will also limit the visual intrusion into the space. If necessary extra panels can be added to the walls at a later date. We are currently trying to determine the best product to use for this job.

The toilets in the hall are being decorated and this should be complete by the end of January.
