From the Manse...

Some months ago now, I was talking to someone who had just experienced indoor skydiving!

That may sound like an oxymoron - for surely skydiving has to be out in the open as you throw yourself out of a plane? Well, if you would like to have a go, you can experience all this for yourself not too far up the road from here at Airkixin in Basingstoke.

Pride of place is their 14ft (4.3m) diameter, super-smooth, super-fast and super-cool wind tunnel for indoor skydiving. Your "flight" only lasts a minute, which seems far longer, as you seek to keep yourself stable in the wind at terminal velocity (the speed at which a falling body experiences zero acceleration during free-fall). And crucially, to make sure you can get into a good position to smile for the photo. Of course, indoor skydiving is far cheaper than leaping out of a plane and has the added advantage that it is not dependent on weather conditions or the elements.

Humanity has always been fascinated by the ability of birds to fly and has sought to emulate them in many ways in the past. Skydiving is perhaps the closest that we can get to that at this moment in time. Perhaps it is that ability to soar into the vast expanse of sky and be free that we envy and seek to experience ourselves.

In Doris Stickney's book for children, 'Water bugs and Dragonflies' the transformed water bug is able to spread its newly acquired wings and find freedom and release from that which had previously restricted it.

Sentiments echoed in Charles Wesley's great Easter hymn, "Christ the Lord is risen today!" where he proclaims;

"Soar we now where Christ has led, Alleluia! Following our exalted Head, Alleluia! Made like him, like him we rise, Alleluia! Ours the cross, the grave, the skies, Alleluia!"

May we this Eastertide know freedom and release from all that would hold us, trap us and imprison us, as we soar on wings like eagles, safe in the knowledge that death has been defeated and that we share in His victory.

Dementia Friendly Church

Wantage Methodist Church has now been registered with the Alzheimer's Society's Dementia Friends programme, which is the biggest ever initiative to change people's perceptions of dementia. It aims to transform the way the nation thinks, acts and talks about the condition.

As part of our commitment to this important work, there will be a **dementia awareness evening** on Wednesday 18th April in the church itself from 7:30 pm – 9:30 pm.

This will be a general introduction to dementia and how it affects people, how we as a church and as individuals can best respond, the kind of things to do and say as well as those things that would not be helpful to do or say. We will be looking at what is good practice for a church seeking to be dementia friendly and looking at practical steps etc.

This training session will be ecumenical with staff and volunteers from Cornerstone and members of Grove Free Evangelical Church also joining us.

We are delighted that the evening will be led for us by Louise Morse who works for the Pilgrims' Friend Society, and is herself an author of several books on Dementia.

This event is open to all, to those who wish to find out more, who have an interest in Dementia or whose lives have been touched by it.

As we look to ensure that as a church we are as dementia friendly as possible, it will be of particular help to pastoral visitors, church stewards, door stewards, and those who help at church lunches etc.

For those who have completed the **Creating Safer Space Foundation Module**, but four years or more ago, the **refresher module** will be run at Trinity Church Abingdon on Wednesday 9th May at 7:30 pm, again, this will last two hours. On Tuesday 1st May at Wantage Methodist Church at 7:30 pm there will be a **Circuit Safeguarding Forum**. This is a meeting for all Church Safeguarding Officers, Circuit Staff and anyone who has an interest in Safeguarding issues to meet together informally for support and an opportunity to be brought up to date on any news/developments that have come from either the District or Connexion.

Church of England and Methodist Church to continue exploring closer communion

Following debate at the General Synod, the Church of England's Faith and Order Commission will now undertake further refinement and clarification on proposals that would see the Church of England and the Methodist Church enter into a relationship of communion and enable an interchange of their presbyteral ministries. Building on the theological convergence encapsulated in An Anglican-Methodist Covenant, signed in 2003, and the work of the Covenant's Joint Implementation Commission from 2003-2014, acceptance of the proposals would mark a further step on the journey of reconciliation between the two Churches.

After the debate, the Revd Gareth J Powell, Secretary of the Methodist Conference, said: "We are very grateful to the Church of England for this opportunity to address the General Synod and discuss the progress we are making together on the path towards reconciliation and the ordering of our existing ministries in a way that reflects the needs and wishes of both Churches.

"We recognise that these are matters of significance to all within our Churches. As we move forward, we will continue to discern the will of God and deepen our understanding of each other through ongoing dialogue."

The proposals are already available for discussion in both Churches. In light of the further work, and to enable time for proper reflection, it is unlikely that the proposals will be brought to the Methodist Conference for discussion before 2019.

Fr. John's Retirement

The Vicar of Wantage, Fr. John Salter, will retire on 1st April 2018. His last service in the Parish will be to Celebrate Mass on Easter Day.

McCabe Educational Trust 4th Sponsored Walk : Hula Valley January 2018

In January, a group of 70 supporters of the McCabe Educational Trust (including Julie Horton) braved a very wet Holy Land to complete the fourth bi-annual Sponsored Walk. Funds are still being collected but the result is going to be of the order of £30,000. This will enable the Trust to maintain its regular grant aid through 2018. Visits were made to two of the main recipients of the funding; The Jeel al Amal Boys' Home in Bethany and Al Shurooq school for the visually impaired in Bethlehem.

This year the walk was in four sections showing the variety of landscapes in Israel/Palestine. Starting with the Via Dolorosa in Jerusalem, then entering the Judean desert with a walk featuring St George's Monastery. On to Galileeand a lakeside walk in Capernaum. Finally walking all round the Argoman Lake in the Hulah Valley in the company of thousands of migrating birds.

Participants paid their own costs so all the money raised will be used in full to support the projects of the Trust.



The Al Shurooq school for the Blind provides total care and education for children from the age of 2. Some parents can make a small contribution to the school but many are from very poor families, or have been abandoned because of their disability. The Trust sends a quarterly grant towards the staff salaries and other running costs.

Jeel al Amal Boys' Home in Bethany has some 300 children attending and 100 boys live there. The children come from Jerusalem and elsewhere in the southern part of the West Bank/Palestine. Many are orphans and many have endured serious domestic problems.
