

### From the Manse....

During an Easter morning service a few years ago, I asked a member of the congregation to come and join me at the front of the church. This I hasten to add had all been planned and pre-arranged.

As he stood alongside me, I produced a pair of sharp scissors from behind the pulpit and cut off his tie just below the knot and then asked him to return to his seat.

Needles to say, the congregation were somewhat taken aback and shocked by what happened. Partly, because they had never seen Chris wear a tie to church before, but more importantly, they hadn't expected me to do what I did!

We then sang a hymn, had some prayers and continued with the service, before I returned to the subject of the mutilated tie.

The point I wanted to make was really quite simple.

Suppose later that day, a member of the congregation who had witnessed my assault on that piece of paisley fabric, bumped into someone from church who hadn't been able to be at the service that morning and they went on to tell them all that had taken place.

What would the reaction of the other person be? Would they think that they were being fooled or wound up? Would they think it was a joke, or that perhaps somehow the person telling the story had got it wrong and was mistaken?

Then later on, that same person who had been absent that morning spoke to others who had been there and heard the same tale regarding the tie. It wouldn't take long before they began to believe that the incident was both true and had been factually reported.

The initial reaction of many who heard the story that Jesus was alive; that he was risen from the dead, was disbelief and confusion - they thought it was a fanciful tale. (Mark 16:8, Luke 24:11, 22-24, John 20:24-25).

However, as more and more people testified to the fact that they had seen him, so the reality and the enormity of what God had done began to sink in.

The message of the "Good News" which begun as lone voices, soon became a tumultuous cacophony proclaiming, He is risen, He is risen indeed, Alleluia!

We will be adding our own voices to that same message on Easter Sunday and I will, I promise, leave my scissors at home!

### **WE'VE BEEN THERE FOR REFUGEES SINCE 1945**

It's better to die in a refugee camp than to die in a war - to risk your children's lives in a plastic dinghy - to leave everything you know behind. When the alternative is terror, bombs and bullets, almost anything is better. This terrible choice faces tens of millions of people worldwide

Nejebar fled Afghanistan with her family when the Taliban after first blinding, then murdering, a member of their family, threatened to kill her husband, Noor, a teacher. When the family arrived at the refugee camp in Greece, they thought they would only stay for 10 days. But they've been living there in a tent for six months now and there's no end in sight.

Christian Aid Week was set up 60 years ago to support our work with refugees in Europe following the Second World War. 
