From the Manse...

There are signs of new life all around us, the days are lengthening, snowdrops, crocuses, and daffodils are coming in to flower and the birds are singing. Spring is on its way, but not here yet, it is definitely coming although we will have to wait a bit longer before we can fully enjoy it.

With Spring not officially arriving until 20th March, we find ourselves living in the waiting times between the end of February and winter and the early weeks of the third month.

We eagerly await all that is to come with the promise of spring.

However, we must not forget the importance of living in the present even as we look to what is still to come, otherwise, we miss all that is around us and the joy of the immanent and the here and now. As we await the arrival of spring in all its fullness and beauty, as we await the arrival of Easter, may we make the most of the everyday that surrounds us and in it be surprised by the one who gives us life.

A Secretary's Prayer



All We Can: The church has just sent its third partnership contribution in this Partnership year, totalling £712. This money came from: £209 collected at the church coffee morning on Feb 9th, £63 from the Gift Aid Small Donation Scheme returned by HMRC, £40 from regular donations by members, and £400 donated by the Sharp family in memory of Joyce Sharp. £165 of this money was gift aided, which will increase the value by about £41. The total sent in this Partnership year (i.e. since early November) is £1,675.
