

#### From the Manse...

The other day I received a letter addressed to me via Wantage Methodist Church. It was neatly and carefully hand-written on heavy Basildon Bond writing paper, complete with its iconic watermark. It was a joy to receive and a reminder of days gone by when to write in such a way when corresponding with others was the norm.

Most of the communication I receive these days, particularly for work is almost all via email, or if by post, then it is a typed letter. The person who sent me this exquisite hand-written letter explained that they were not on-line and didn't do emails.

A reminder that in this all pervasive digital world in which we now live, there is a real danger of unintentionally isolating, ignoring and disempowering all those who, for whatever reason, are not part of this technological revolution.

A few days later there was a post on Twitter stating that "social media strategist Meredith Gould is so convinced that incarnational presence is already happening virtually that she has revised the famous prayer of St. Teresa of Avila's 'Christ has no body' for our digital age".

#### "Christ Has No Online Presence but Yours

Christ has no online presence but yours,
No blog, no Facebook page but yours,
Yours are the tweets through which love touches this world,
Yours are the posts through which the Gospel is shared,
Yours are the updates through which hope is revealed.
Christ has no online presence but yours,
No blog, no Facebook page but yours."

St. Teresa of Avila was born 502 years ago and Gould's fresh interpretation and perspective of this most famous of prayers by this Spanish mystic, Roman Catholic saint, Carmelite nun and writer, is a timely reminder of an ancient truth.

For whether we communicate using the latest cutting edge technology, or we use a fountain pen and ink, whether we use Skype or Face Time to see and speak to others all around the world, or we simply have face to face conversation with those we meet, the way that we interact with others reflects upon the one we call Lord.

Ever since the ascension, it is our hands, feet, voices, words, deeds and actions that are to be His in the world, so that all may know and see. So as our pens and keyboards are used to communicate our thoughts and feelings, may they help us to ensure that what we write and say, reflect well upon the one who is the living Word.

#### St Nicholas Church Flower Festival and Exhibition / Sale of original paintings



St Nicholas Church in East Challow is a Grade II listed building, with origins dating back to ~ 1000-1100. It has been modified and improved throughout the centuries, and the most recent major works were carried out during the Victorian period. The church is considered by its parishioners as an attractive, warm and holy space. Although it is in good order, well maintained and

much loved it needs to be adapted to modern requirements and to incorporate modern facilities. The congregation is highly dedicated and committed, and is eager to enhance its mission and pastoral outreach to the wider community. We currently have regular Sunday worship each week and during the week, and the church is open every day during daylight hours for prayer and quiet contemplation. However, we do wish to use the church building for a wider range of worship and other community activities, and recognise that we need to adapt the building to the requirements of the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. We are raising funds in order to sensitively introduce those modern facilities in order to make the building more accessible and welcoming to the wider community. This involves rearranging the church entrance area to provide a more direct access into the church, to further improve access via a ramped access path and to provide a disabled toilet and some limited catering facilities.

These improvements are aimed at both wider worship and community use and access, and particularly to serve the needs of the elderly and young families. This is in the context of major housing developments in the village and surrounding area. The growing population and changing demographics will provide the focus for our desire to serve our community.

We need to raise a total ~ £45,000. We are now busy with that fund raising, and are making good progress. As part of the planned fund raising activities we are organising a Flower Festival and Exhibition / Sale of original paintings over the weekend of  $7^{th}$  /  $8^{th}$  October. The Flower Festival in the church will have a theme centred on Biblical characters, and will involve the congregation, village organisations, and the village church school. Lunches, refreshments, and sale of produce and crafts will be available in the adjacent village hall. Also in the village hall we will be holding an Exhibition and Sale of original paintings, in acrylics, oils, watercolours and pastels, from three of our church members.

A quote from two of the organisers, Juliet Teare and Jeff Penfold, "As well as raising funds for this exciting and important project we see it very much as a community event, and an opportunity for us all to work together as a joint venture".

#### **Yotam Theu**

Mark Sandels, Mission Secretary

Grove Methodist Church has sponsored Yotam Theu, the leader of "Christian Church" in Malawi, since 1998. Together we have helped Christian Church to build new church buildings and paid for a truck for Church use in 2014. Mark Sandels met Yotam in 1988 when he visited his sister, who taught Yotam under her VSO placement. There has been long-standing prayer and financial support, which has seen the Church Yotam registered with the Malawian Government grow to many congregations as Yotam's evangelistic programme has progressed.

This year sees two new developments in the work Yotam is doing. He and the leaders of Christian Church have decided to build a campus in Mzuzu, the capital of the Northern District where Yotam lives. The campus will provide a focus for training leaders and evangelists. The other project is to buy a new truck. The current truck was already 20 years old when he brought it and has had nearly 4 years of heavy use and is in need of replacement.

Fundraising for the new truck has already started. The aim is to send £15,000 or so in Summer 2019. Yotam has some money to help start building the Campus but will need additional funding over the next few years to resource the training programme based on the campus.

Can you think of a link between loved buildings, welcoming people, hedgerows filled with blackberries, sunshine, country roads, champagne, ancient frescos, a wedding party, a sunny wooden bench to sit and enjoy a picnic, a shiny kettle, a crowd gathering for a Baptism, interesting people to talk to, and the knowledge that every church you visit counts?

These are just a few of the things that Clive and I saw and enjoyed during the annual Ride and Stride for the Historic Churches charity on September 9<sup>th</sup>. Cycling through the Vale of the White Horse is always our favourite route, and every year we say what a difference it makes to find someone at the church to welcome us. The offer of refreshment is always welcome, but it is the conversation which makes each visit unique, and each year we learn something new about their churches. These

ancient buildings are so lovingly cared for and we love to make time to have a look around and listen to all that is going on. Clearly all churches are struggling to find enough people to fill the tasks that need doing, and one lady was not a church goer herself, but opens and locks the church every day so that anyone passing would be able to drop in if they wanted. Another lady told me that all her three sons are builders and their work is primarily restoring church buildings. Their skills include



roofing, plastering and making oak furniture for the various churches we were visiting.

As we travelled along, I constantly thought of and appreciated the number of people who were sitting and welcoming visitors to our church. Thank you to all those who offered to do this, not only for the visitors, but so that it meant Clive and I were able to get out and enjoy a lovely day out during which time we visited 19 churches and travelled around 25 miles. A big thank you too to those who generously sponsored us and others who rode or strode that day, as so far over £300 has been raised and that sum will increase with gift aid added. This money is shared between the Historic Churches fund and our own church, so you could say that everyone's a winner and that is how it so often is when we do things in God's name.

June and Alan Grunwald walked 6 miles and visited 4 churches as well as Great Coxwell Barn, which was an added bonus. They were pleasantly surprised that their rusty map reading skills enabled them to navigate a circular walk from Badbury Hill,

through Faringdon and out to Great Coxwell. They took fright at a "Bull in Field" sign which entailed a slightly longer walk back to the National Trust car park at Badbury. The highlights of their walk included a history exhibition at the Friends Meeting House (and delicious cake) and a beautiful modern stained glass window at Great Coxwell church.

Gordon and Gill write: We went East this year, starting in Grove then Denchworth and Hanney, travelling with the wind across the plain to Steventon, Drayton and Milton.
