From the Manse...

The fact that when the morning alarm goes off in our house, it is still dark outside; the changing colours of the trees as I walk Brodie around the park and the 'autumnal feel' in the air, all point to the conclusion that summer is over. We are now in that period of mellow fruitfulness as we say our farewells to summer and await the coming of winter.

This is the period of Harvest Festivals and harvest celebrations. It is a time of gathering in, a time of bounty and a time of plenty. It is also of course a time of thankfulness.

Whilst the poignancy of saying thank you for a harvest safely gathered in, may now be lost on us by the fact that we can have what we want to eat all year round, there is, nonetheless, a sense of saying thank you at this time of year.

Our Harvest Festival services, whether accompanied by traditional harvest hymns, or modern worship songs, give us the chance to celebrate a constant and daily reality – that God gives us our daily bread. Yet, how good are we at remembering this fact outside of harvest time?

I remember how, a few years ago now, Rev'd John Hellyer the Chair of my previous District, in an almost throw-away line, said that he was more and more convinced that our worship and our prayers should be rooted and grounded in thankfulness.

We say thank you to God for our food and all that we have at Harvest time, but do we suffer from having a kind of selective amnesia for the rest of the year? After all, each day is a new blessing, each new dawn a new gift – yet how do we respond to this? Do we have a sense of thankfulness or do we simply take it for granted?

We know how much we can be disappointed when we do not receive a thank you letter for the carefully chosen gift or present sent, or our efforts and hard work go unacknowledged – how much more God, when we forget to say thank you for all that He continually gives us?

As we once more celebrate the harvest, may we also commit ourselves to continually saying 'thank you' to God for all that we have and for all that He gives us, for indeed we are richly blest.

Marriage and Relationships 2018

Within the Church, people have many views about human relationships and the nature and purpose of marriage. There are fundamental issues in relation to human relationships in the modern world in the life of the church which may or may not lead the Methodist Church to reconsider its understanding of relationships and definition of marriage. These issues include the fact that a major change to the law in 2014 enabled the introduction of same-sex civil marriage, and gave churches and other religious groups the legal ability to opt-in to conduct weddings for same-sex partners if they so wished. But same-sex marriage is not the only consideration.

The Conference in 2014 and subsequently has therefore urged the Methodist people to engage with each other honestly, prayerfully and graciously in a process of deep reflection and discernment about matters relating to marriage and human relationships.

The 2018 Conference directed the Marriage and Relationships Task Group to bring a report to the Conference in 2019 setting out a number of theological arguments and recommendations concerning the most pressing issues in the Church's understanding of relationships and marriage.

The Conference also adopted a Notice of Motion which directed the Task Group to ensure that the recommendations to be brought to the Conference include options for "a way forward that is consistent with the existing commitment to live with contradictory convictions" and enable, amongst other things, "those who feel called by God to solemnise same sex marriages to do so" and "protection for ministers, probationers, members and churches prevented by conscience from participation in such services".

There were several comments in the debates at the Conference that, despite numerous opportunities over many years for consultation about the Church's understanding of relationships and marriage, many individuals and local churches had not engaged much in discussion of the pressing issues. The Task Group is keen to encourage such conversations in every part of the life of the Church in this current connexional year, leading up to the Task Group's presentation of its report to the Conference in 2019.

New Methodist Youth President promises a year of courageousness



Jasmine Yeboah was inducted as the new Youth President of the Methodist Church with a service at St Mark's Methodist Church, Tottenham, London on Saturday 1 September.

Jasmine, herself from Tottenham and a member of St Mark's, will represent thousands of young people across the UK in this important role in the life of the Church.

She has taken up the position of Youth President following an election at last November's 3Generate, the Methodist Children and Youth Assembly and takes over from Michael Pryke.

In her inaugural address, Jasmine thanked Michael for his work over the past year before moving on to her own priorities and motivations for the year ahead.

Jasmine says: "My focus for the coming year is courageousness and courageous loving. To be loving of yourself, of others and, most importantly, of God. I want to challenge young people to do things differently, to try new things; from writing to your MP and campaigning for change, through to getting sponsored to do something exciting for a charity."

Outgoing Youth President Michael Pryke commented: "My year in office went by in a flash, full of adventures and experiences. My advice to Jasmine, and to all Youth Presidents, is to take time to take it all in and to focus on the goals that will empower young people."

The Wantage and Grove Foodbank is a practical, community based project, organised by local churches, which provides food parcels to those in our area who find themselves temporarily in difficult circumstances. We are dependent upon donations of food and are staffed by church volunteers.


If you wish to donate food there are collection points at: The Independent Advice Centre, Kings bookshop, Wantage & Cornerstone Coffee Shop, Grove. (Or contact your local church).

All food needs to be tinned or packets (with a shelf life of 3-6months if possible). Please remember that we cannot use out of date items or homemade items.

Referrals are made by a number of agencies including: The Butler Centre, The Independent Advice Centre, the Health Centre and local churches. The Food bank is intended to provide short term emergency help to people who find themselves for whatever reason (be it job loss, benefit problems or ill health) unable to feed themselves or their families.

Many thanks for the generous donations of food and money. Both are much appreciated. With Harvest Festival donations, this is now the time of year when stocks will be high so the box in the Wantage chapel vestibule will not be used for a while. Money donations are always welcomed as some items quite often need to be bought – e.g. long life milk and fruit juice. I have now received the tax reclaimed from all donations given to Grove Methodist Church for the tax year 2017 - 2018. The main Gift Aid raised £6513.29 and the Gift Aid Small Donations Scheme (GASDS) raised a further £901.86, making a total of £7415.15.

I would like to thank everyone for giving in this way. We have just raised nearly £7500 without further financial contributions by ourselves.

The main Gift Aid scheme is a simple way of increasing ones giving without cost to oneself as long as one is a tax payer. It can be done on a regular basis through a standing order into the Church's bank account, the weekly envelope scheme, or if you are not part of the weekly envelope scheme, by using the gift aid envelopes available at the door. You will be given a unique number so no names need be put on the envelopes. If you pay tax but do not already participate, and are interested, please see me.

We are starting to plan to celebrate our 175th anniversary in 2020.
