Financial Crisis

At the last Church Council it was clear from last year's financial statement that we have a financial crisis. A small working party has been addressing the issue and reported to the Church Leadership Team on Thursday this last week.

Last year we had a deficit of about £7000 and the church's total balances at the year end – August- were just under 24 thousand pounds. The first call on our finances is the Circuit assessment which is our contribution to the work of the Methodist Church in our circuit, district and the connexion. This is £12400 / quarter this year. At church council it was clear that there is not enough money in the current accounts to pay this, this quarter. This is a serious issue.

Some costs can be reduced and proposals are going to CLT to action these.

However we must increase our income as well.

This announcement is to share the situation with you all and there will be more information in the notices and next newsletter.

Up to this time the donations for **after-church tea/coffee** have been given to the **Benevolent fund**. However, **due to the church's difficult financial situation, that money will now go into the church general fund**. The responsibility for a Benevolent fund will be taken by the circuit.

As a continuing effort to restore our financial situation, we invite the congregation **not to exchange Christmas cards, but to make a donation to the church instead**. This does not prevent you from exchanging cards with your friends, but just to say that the pigeon holes will not be put out as in previous years.

Food Bank at Christmas time

To help make Christmas special food those receiving food parcels at Christmas it would be great if there were a good number of special items in those parcels such as tins of ham, box of chocolates and other luxury goodies. Please consider donating something special in the next couple of weeks. Thank you.
