Use of the Church Car Park for Sunday Morning Services

The reality of our church's parking facilities is that they are inadequate for our needs. A car park to meet those needs would require a bigger piece of land, to provide a greater number of wider parking spaces, set within a sufficiently large area of land that would make manoeuvring easier.

Unfortunately, we cannot meet any of those requirements, nor can we build a new car park, but the parking needs amongst our congregation continue to increase, outpacing our ability to meet them.

This has necessitated a rethink of how we can continue to assist those with serious mobility needs and do all we can to enable them to attend Sunday Morning Services safely.

After careful consideration of how best to resolve this problem, the system proposed and agreed by the Church Leadership Team, with immediate implementation, is as follows:

- On Sunday mornings, the entire car park, except the space reserved for the Minister or Worship Leader, will be restricted for use only by those whose disability necessitates arrival by car onto the church site.
- Parking spaces will no longer be reserved with a named chair in a specific parking space.
- Permits have been given to each qualifying disabled regular worshipper, and to drivers who regularly give lifts to any of these people.
- Anyone who needs a permit in the future should make their request to one of the Church Stewards.
- Please remember that the slope leading to Church Street must be kept clear for pedestrian access, especially those who use a walking aid or need to hold onto the arm of a helper.

To help make Christmas special for those receiving food parcels at Christmas it would be great if there were a good number of special items in those parcels such as tins of ham, box of chocolates and other luxury goodies. Financial Crisis

At the last Church Council it was clear from last year's financial statement that we have a financial crisis. A small working party has been addressing the issue and reported to the Church Leadership Team.

Last year we had a deficit of about £7000 and the church's total balances at the year end – August- were just under 24 thousand pounds. The first call on our finances is the Circuit assessment which is our contribution to the work of the Methodist Church in our circuit, district and the connexion. This is £12400 / quarter this year. At church council it was clear that there is not enough money in the current accounts to pay this, this quarter. This is a serious issue.

Some costs can be reduced and proposals are being progressed to action these. However we must increase our income as well.

There will be an extra Church Council on Thursday 15 January 2026.

This announcement is to share the situation with you all.

Up to this time the donations for **after-church tea/coffee** have been given to the **Benevolent fund**. However, **due to the church's difficult financial situation, that money will now go into the church general fund**. The responsibility for a Benevolent fund will be taken by the circuit.

As a continuing effort to restore our financial situation, we invite the congregation **not to exchange Christmas cards, but to make a donation to the church instead**. This does not prevent you from exchanging cards with your friends, but just to say that the pigeonholes will not be put out as in previous years.

There will be a meeting of the **Property & Finance group on December 11th at 7:30pm** in the Parlour. Anyone with an interest in this area of our Church work is welcome to attend.
