From the Manse.....

This Connexional year has seen so many “lasts” for me as we have journeyed together and followed the seasons of the liturgical cycle of the church, each bringing its own added poignancy.

I now come to this, my last letter to you and I find myself pondering what to write. There is so much that I could say as I reflect on these past nine years and all that we have shared together. My overriding emotion though is one of thankfulness and gratitude.

This has been a great appointment and although there have been challenges along the way, (not least Covid) we have been blessed throughout by God’s presence with us and for that we give thanks.

I still remember that wet Saturday in November 2015 when we, as a family, came to look around the Circuit having been ‘matched’ in Stationing. We met so many of you as we visited the churches and had a look at the Circuit.

The day went by in a bit of a blur: so many people, so many new faces, so many names, so much to see and then to remember. However, one thing was obvious and very apparent – that this was the right place for us and that the Connexional Stationing Committee had done a good job.

Nine years on and, as we prepare to say goodbye and thank you, some words of the communion hymn “I Come with joy to meet my Lord,” by Brian Wren, come readily to mind.

It has been a privilege to be invited into your lives and homes and be able to share with you in those times of birth and loss, of celebration and sadness, of joy and of tears as well as in all the ordinariness of life.

The last verse of the hymn tells us that,

And as his people in the world,
We’ll live and speak his praise.”*

Itinerancy and moving on, whether to a new Circuit appointment or into retirement, is always about saying ‘hello’ and ‘goodbye’. So as Liz and I prepare to say thank you and farewell, I know that you will welcome Bruce and Georgina into your hearts and homes just as you did us.

Hopefully that information has given us all food for thought!



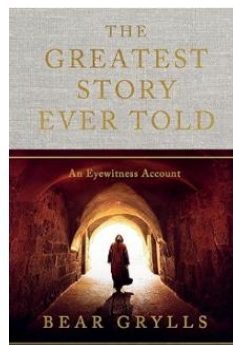

REPORT OF OUR APRIL & MAY 2025 ACTIVITIES

"Wantage is in a good mood!", reported one of our Street Pastor teams. What a wonderful description of a peaceful but busy evening – exactly what Street Pastors are working towards! That night we met a man who was homeless. We spent some time listening to him. We gave him some water and got him something to eat. We also spent some time with another man who was sad, angry and in some emotional turmoil. We listened to him, tried to encourage him and offered to pray for him, which he gratefully accepted.

In Grove our team met a young lad standing at the bus stop on his own. He was heading home from a friend's house sooner than expected and was on the phone to his mum. Our Street Pastors offered to wait with him - which his mum thought a great idea. The bus arrived five minutes later. He didn't have any money so we were very happy to pay his fare.

One of our patrols met a lady who had been drinking and had become bad-tempered. Having lent her jacket to her friend she asked us for a space blanket to help keep her warm. On top of this she realised that she had left her handbag in one of the pubs and went off to find it. Our team caught up with her later on and checked that she had found her bag and that she and her friend had a way of getting home. They assured us that a lift was on its way.

Our afternoon patrol met a group of girls and a boy in Wantage and spent some time chatting with them about Wantage, Grove and life generally. They also met a young man who shared with them about his life, relationships, the anxiety he suffers and his faith. Another team cared for two men who were unwell after having drunk too much. One had a friend with him who was looking after him and the other we gave some water and stayed with him for a while.



Writing on this the longest day of the year, in which every hour is filled with bright warm sunshine, it is not surprising that memories of summertime hymns are awakened. It was in *Hymns and Psalms*, but didn't make it into *Singing the Faith*.. "Summer suns are glowing" has to rest in the memories of our church family members who are content to be thought of as elderly!

*"Summer suns are glowing over land and sea,

Everything rejoices in the mellow rays,

It may not have the appeal of contemporary hymns in which we enjoy the inspiring blend of meaningful words and melodic tunes. However, it does capture the elements of summertime, whose arrival we look forward to, as we welcome days full of brightness and warmth, colour and light, all epitomising the beauty of God's creation within our natural world.

The summer months of July and August, within the context of our Church, mark the drawing to a close of one year as we anticipate the beginning of the new Methodist Year in September. He has enriched our experience, introduced us to new ways of exploring our faith, and comforted and supported us in pastoral situations during sad and difficult times, as well as sharing our joys at times of celebration. For all of these features of his ministry amongst us in Wantage, we say a big thank you.

Similarly we hope that the summer months will provide enjoyment for everyone staying at home, perhaps with opportunities for outings and summertime treats.

Farewell Letter from Mike & Judith Skinner

You may have read in the newsletter that we are transferring membership to Falmouth (a Baptist, our closest church) where we'll be continuing our faith journey. We're maintaining a presence in Wantage as it's really helpful for regular visits to Judith's mum in MHA Leicester, as well as daughters and grandchildren in Birmingham and London.

Letting our membership of WMC go (after 33 years) is a strange and rather sad feeling! Thank you all for your constant prayers, fellowship, friendship and support. Before coming to WMC we had been members in 5 churches since the late 70s, due to education then work moves, with stays never longer than 4 years. It was therefore lovely to be able to bring up our girls in a strong and steady Methodist congregation, with too many lovely memories to list!

We'd planned to try out different churches in Wantage but when Verena happily walked out alone with Pauline to toddlers (held across the road in the undertakers, as the Hall had only recently been completed), something she'd not done before, we knew this was the church for us.

We were overwhelmed by the welcome from a congregation that had the faith and commitment to undertake the radical construction of the new Hall complex, to serve their mission and the community. Shortly afterwards, Verena was joined by younger sister Natalie and we will be forever thankful for the love and support they both received from dedicated, loving care they received in junior church, youth fellowship and youth group. The experiences, examples and friendship they received contributed hugely to the fact that both are committed members of evangelical communities (free and Anglican) in Birmingham and London, as are their husbands and young children. Similarly, those deep-rooted experiences have supported them as they went through medical studies and training.

We have so many amazing memories of life at WMC (shaped mainly by the humbling examples of Christian commitment, dedication and care shown by so many in the congregation and community), so many indeed that it's impossible to acknowledge the role they all played in developing and supporting our family life. We feel so blessed by the quality of pastoral leadership from which we've benefitted, under Michael, Andrew, Brenda, Martin and Keith. We feel equally humbled by the unswerving sacrifice and commitment made by so many in so many aspects of the life of our Church and community over the years: by Graham and Jessie, John & Margaret, Pam & David, Jenny, Julie, Gill and Gordon, Alison & Clive, Eileen, Ann, Andrew and Sharon - to mention just a few.

The transient nature of all this left Judith feeling rather unsettled until she began making regular weekly walks with a local group of Christian women. When she was also offered a council allotment to nurture as her own project (a pleasant counterbalance to Mike's time spent maintaining the sailing boat we both enjoy), it felt like God was calling us to a new start, leading us to a new spiritual home and fellowship, as well as stimulating challenges to our faith, at Emmanuel Baptist Church. It's within walking distance (and close to the allotment site!) and we will be transferring our membership there in September (if they vote to have us!).

We'll still follow news of life at WMC as it adapts to the changes coming later this year and will be in Wantage regularly so hope to keep in touch. Who knows, we might also see and spend time with some of you in Falmouth and the county, either to stay with us or (like Kelvin) to enjoy the hospitality available in the town.
