How we helped on the streets

In the last year we have seen an increase in the numbers of people in Wantage and Grove on Friday and Saturday nights. The opening of Delaney's Club (previously Shush!) in August seems to have boosted the night time economy, although it's not back to pre-Covid levels just yet.

During 2022/23 we cared for 35 individuals who were in some way vulnerable and attended 13 incidents that were in some way aggressive. In September our team were in Wantage when a man, who was spoiling for a fight, went off and brought back a kitchen knife. No one was injured by the knife and our Street Pastors did exactly the right thing by staying at a safe distance, calling the police and helping people when it was safe to do so.

As well as responding to incidents as they happen, Street Pastors spend time listening to people and praying for them either by contacting our Prayer Support Volunteers or taking time on the street to pray with the individual if they wish. One night we met a man who was leaving one of the nighttime venues and was fearful that he was going to be beaten up for some reason. He came straight over to talk to us until his potential assailants had gone. We spent some time with him and prayed for him and his family situation.

2022 AGM

Our 2021/22 AGM took place in July 2022 with both in-person and on-line attendance on a hot and sunny evening at Wantage Baptist Church, which was quite a shift from the dark October pattern we've had previously. The main reason for the change was to progress our vision to employ a part-time Social Networker and we wanted the input and prayers of our members to progress this. As well as the usual business we were encouraged to proceed with the recruitment plan to raise the profile of Street Pastors caring, listening and helping on the streets of our local communities.

CIO Progress

Members endorsed a proposal to transfer Wantage & Grove Street Pastors from an *Unincorporated Group* to a *Charitable Incorporated Organisation* (CIO) at our 2020 AGM. We submitted our paperwork and are still waiting to hear back from Ascension Trust Legal Team.

Financial overview

We ended the 2022-23 financial year with a surplus of £650 compared with a surplus £4,942 in the previous financial year. The table below summarises our income and expenditure.

We continue to receive grant funding from Oxfordshire County Council and also an increased amount from the TVP Community Action Fund. We also received some smaller but welcome grants from other supporters of WGSP.

Church support is lower than last year mainly because last year there was a substantial one-off donation from one of our supporting churches.

We are grateful to those supporters who give by standing order (18 in total) who have maintained their giving at the same level as last year and also to other supporters making one-off donations.

Some areas of expenditure have increased, in particular staff costs due to inflation and the development of our social media presence. These have been more than offset by reduced costs elsewhere, however, some of these relate to one-off expenses from last year.

We are grateful for the continuing support we receive from members, the public and charitable bodies, especially at this time when many are experiencing reductions in their income together with greater demands on available charitable funds. Our work continues to be recognised and valued at all levels within the community. Thank you!

Online Networking

Since employing Sky Shoemark as our Online Networker we have:

- Researched what other Street Pastor initiatives are doing online - what works and what doesn't work.
- Created accounts with Instagram and TikTok
- Developed a plan for regular social media posts throughout the year
- Improved our facebook page
- Posted SP & PSV team pictures & videos, encouraging Bible verses, safety advice and guidance for the night time economy
- Grown our following:

Instagram: 241 followers (up from zero)

TikTok: 153 followers (up from zero)

We were very pleased with our first TikTok video having 4,000+ views - but our most recent video has 37,000 views. Keep up the good work, Sky.

Trustee Goals for 2023/24

Safeguarding

In the past year, the trustees have reviewed and approved the updated Safeguarding Policy and Procedures. Anne Cheeseman (our Designated Safeguarding Officer) delivered two in-person Safeguarding training sessions. 12 Street Pastors from Wantage & Grove attended, with 8 participants from other local areas. Feedback was very positive and included the following comments:

"Engaging and thought provoking."

"Fabulous. Informative, relevant, enjoyable and interactive for a subject that can be quite complex and procedural. A well spent Saturday afternoon."

"The best interactive course I can remember attending – of the many courses that I've done."

A key message from the training is that if anyone has the slightest concern about something that occurs while on patrol, please discuss it with your Designated Safeguarding Officer (DSO).

In the last year, two incidents have been raised with the DSO; while neither of these incidents met the threshold for reporting to Adult Social Care, it was helpful to discuss them and records have been kept on file in our locked filing cabinet.

Each year our Management Committee sets goals to help focus our efforts and to ensure that we continue to serve our community well. We centre our goals around the key areas of delivering patrols, finances and relationships.

 - including Street Pastor messages and Bible verses
 - Pursue Daytime Patrols
- Finance:
 - Secure funding to cover our costs

 - Complete the transition of WGSP into a Charitable Incorporated Organisation
 - Recruit two new Trustees
 - Over with statutory and third sector agencies to help people in the night time economy
